
President's Notes

The Friends have recently assisted with the development of text for a new Interpretive panel for the Northern section of the Gardens, setting out the changes to this part of the Gardens over time.

Planting day on 2 September

It seems I was the only one who could attend the planting day at the Gardens on Friday 2 September. I did enjoy working with Sam, Tom and Tiah, and we made a lot of progress. I admire their gardening skills, and wish my garden could look as good as this when tended to. I struggle with kikiyu here in Sunbury and pleasingly, no sign of any rogue strong tendrils in the place where we were gardening, just mushroom compost. It was a little sad that the daffodils had to come out, but were replanted even in full bloom near the drinking fountain.

I will now be able to walk along the south walk and admire the camomile daisies that we planted, always reliant upon them actually growing, and that my planting methods were sufficient. Locals who passed by were bemused to see us working there and some said Hello. I like the fact that the ornamental flowering peach grown from cuttings are all beginning to display their buds bursting into bloom. I think it will look good at the Festival day 18 September.

The livestock in the gardens were busy. The birds, honeyeater wattle birds were not afraid of us until the digging machine went into action. Before that it was the echium that they hunted for nectar in. And I saw only one rat that was running across from bed to bed. And I saw a man walking his dog on a leash on his way to Albion. I used to see him a lot when I was working on the church garden and I would ask him to keep the dog on the leash, which he used to ignore. He seems to have mended his ways.

I ask Damien to pass on my respect for the work these three gardeners are doing in the McKay Gardens. I know they are disappointed when the thieving light fingers of Sunshine take their choice of the newly planted plants in the Gardens. It has been that way forever, probably. It is a constant fight for survival and tenacity.





** President's Note ** We shouldn't forget that there has been damage to, and plants have gone missing, from the Gardens regularly since 1909. As Bill Bampton, former Head Gardener at Heronswood wrote in 2009:

Issues of public safety and property damage compound the challenges of the gardens. I don't think that many private gardens have to contend with newly restored garden beds being routinely set alight. Although it is easy to be nostalgic about the past, as early as 1910 the Footscray Advertiser reported, "Residents at Sunshine are highly indignant at the action, presumably of boys, in rooting up a number of the trees recently planted in the new reserve."
